

Benefit for Iconic Detroit Arts Space the MBAD African Bead Museum

DETROIT, Mich. – Wasserman Projects is proud to announce an upcoming Benefit for the African Bead Museum to be held at Wasserman Projects on December 16th from 4-8pm. The event will be co-sponsored by Gary Wasserman and Charles Kashner of Wasserman Projects, Peter Cummings and Dietrich Knoer of The Platform, and Lorcan O’Herlihy Architects [LOHA] Principal Lorcan O’Herlihy. The host committee is comprised of supporters of the Bead Museum -- Sinead Finnerty-Pyne [LOHA], Everard Findlay, Felicia Eisenberg Molnar, artists Corazon del Sol, Kathy Leisen and Marsha Music -- as well as representatives from Detroit arts institutions -- Elysia Borowy-Reeder [MOCA Detroit], Laura Mott [Cranbrook Art Museum], Alison Wong [Wasserman Projects].

This event is held in conjunction with the closing of the exhibition *Homemade Ice Cream* by artist Jason Yates, and will include live performances, a panel discussion, workshops, and more. The event is timed with a Patronicity fundraising and awareness-building campaign for Olayami Dabls’ African Bead Museum, in support of extensive renovations, designed by Lorcan O’Herlihy Architects [LOHA]. The restoration of the museum will allow for free rotating exhibitions of African material culture from Dabls' extensive collection of beads and artifacts, as well as immersive public spaces for gathering and events.

Free and open to the public, this event will begin with a lively performance by Detroit-based drummer Efe Bes and a bead demonstration by Museum Founder, Olayami Dabls. A panel discussion moderated by Wasserman Director, Alison Wong will follow, and will feature Dabls in conversation with LA|Detroit-based architect Lorcan O’Herlihy, and Director of Planning and Development for the City of Detroit, Maurice Cox. The discussion will focus on the renovation of the Bead Museum and its important role as a catalyst for change in the city of Detroit, and will be followed by comments from longtime friend, supporter, and fellow artist, Marsha Music. While beads and other gifts will be available for purchase throughout the evening, a special paddle raise and auction will offer a chance to support the museum. To conclude the evening, Everard Findlay’s curated selection of local performers will take the stage, including Video7, Greg Baise, and a special guest appearance by Juan Atkins.
